# School Wide Outcomes

- **Attendance:** 97% attendance to 94.8% national average. Children love coming to school here.
- **Wellbeing:** Dedicated member of staff as Welfare Officer and Family Liaison. Working with Mental Health Support Team and our own in house Emotional Literacy Support Assistant.
- **JAGs:** Consistent high take up of children accessing our before and after school provision from **7.30am-6pm** Monday to Friday with a dedicated hall for their use
- **Caterlink:** Incorporating our new 3-week menu with new recipes
