<u>Curriculum this term</u>

The curriculum map, which can be found on the Year 6 page of the website shows the most up-to-date overview of what we aim to cover during this academic year. The information outlined below is specifically related to what we aim to cover this Spring Term. The ideas highlighted below are our aims for teaching; however, these may change according to the needs of the children as the term progresses.

English

We will be continuing with the Power of Reading and will focus on a new book, Dark Sky Park by Philip Gross, which will inspire many exciting writing opportunities. Maths

A reminder that ALL children in Year 6 are expected to login to Times Tables Rock Stars at least 4 times a week. This allows us to track their progress and it is essential that Year 6 children have instant recall of all the multiplication and associated division facts up to 12X12. We will be following the maths topics outlined in the online curriculum map as well as work to help prepare the children for their upcoming SATS (week of the 8th May 2023).

Science

We will look at which characteristics are inherited and focus our discussions by exploring the characteristics of animals. The children will research how living things have adapted to their environments and why some animals have become extinct. Optional work over the Christmas break is for children to research their favourite animal and the habitat that it lives in, with a particular focus on how the animal has adapted to live in that specific environment.

History/Geography

This term in History the children will be investigating how a pile of dragon bones helped to solve an Ancient Chinese mystery in our topic of the Shang Dynasty. In Geography, the children will be investigating why 'Fair Trade' is fair.

<u>Art</u>

In this collection of lessons children learn and develop their skills in: design, drawing, craft, painting and art appreciation. They will be exploring works of Monet and Hopper as well as creating zentangle patterns.

Design Technology

The children will be designing a playground featuring a variety of different structures, giving consideration to how the structures will be used.

RE

The children will be exploring the key questions of 'What does Justice look like?' and 'Was Jesus' death part of God's plan?'.

Computing

We will be starting our touch typing unit as well as introducing the children to Python in order to create digital artwork.

Music - Taught by Sarah Ricketts.

The children will be exploring the topics of Jazz and Blues as well as rhythm. The children will also be listening to and appraising a wide variety of music in our 'Music of the week'.

PΕ

Monday afternoons: Hockey for Spring 1 and Rounders for Spring 2.

Thursday afternoons: Gymnastics.

French – taught by Ms Livingstone

In French, the children's learning will focus on the use of irregular verbs as well as exploring the topic of The Weekend.

PSHE & Citizenship

We will be learning about living in the wider world and will also be discussing the influence that media has in our lives.
